The Climate Change Act 2017 (VIC) sets out a clear policy framework and a pathway to 2050 that is consistent with the Paris Agreement to keep global temperature rise below two degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels.

We recognise the need to take action, and are fully committed to carbon emission reduction.

The proposed EfW plant will help reduce greenhouse gases.

A key component of the feasibility study into the proposed Energy from Waste (EfW) plant at Maryvale Mill included a greenhouse gas assessment by the construction of the project and the plant's operation over 25 years.

- The study found that the EfW plant would deliver a net reduction in Victoria's yearly greenhouse gas emissions by approximately 550,000 tonnes - the equivalent of taking more than 100,000 cars off the road each year.
- The findings reflect the significant annual reduction in net emissions that would result from the diversion of waste from landfill and reduced energy generated from fossil fuel sources, taking into account additional transport distances for waste to Maryvale.
