

# The benefits of creating Energy from Waste



EfW significantly reduces the amount of waste going to landfill at a time when Melbourne faces significant landfill shortages. Around 750,000 tonnes of annual landfill capacity in South East Melbourne will close over the next five years.

An EfW facility at Maryvale Mill would reduce landfill in Gippsland and Melbourne by up to 650,000 tonnes each year, easing pressure on existing landfill sites.

An EfW facility at Maryvale Mill could reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions by 500,000 tonnes per annum. That's the equivalent of removing 100,000 cars from Australia's roads every year.

The development of an EfW facility at Maryvale Mill would support more than 1,600 jobs during the construction phase, and more than 440 direct and indirect jobs ongoing.
